ORDER GRANTING PROTECTION FROM DOMESTIC ABUSE

THIS CAUSE came on for hearing on Petition to Seek an Order of Protection from Domestic Abuse filed by Petitioner against Chubby Too Bloo and as pursuant to Title XXIII of the Choctaw Tribal Code known and cited as the “Mississippi Band of Choctaw Indians’ Protection from Domestic Abuse Law” this Court, after having considered the matter and heard evidence in support thereof, orders, adjudges and decrees as follows, to-wit:

1. This Court has jurisdiction in that Petitioner is an enrolled member of the Mississippi Band of Choctaw Indians, and both Petitioner and Defendant reside in the Tucker Community, Choctaw Indian Reservation, Neshoba County, Mississippi.
2. As required by C.T.C. 23-1-6(1), Petitioner has established by a preponderance of the evidence her allegation of abuse against Defendant, Chubby Too Bloo.
3. The issuance, by this Court, of a Protective Order is necessary to bring about a cessation of abuse of Petitioner, and Defendant is to refrain from harassing, threatening or annoying Petitioner in any manner whatsoever including telephone calls and/or personal visits.

4. Defendant shall not make any contact with Petitioner whatsoever, including but not limited to personal contact and contact by telephone or mail; except during the exchange of the minor child for purposes of visitation and/or medical emergencies involving the minor child.
5. Petitioner shall be awarded temporary custody of the parties' minor child, Little Boy Bloo, subject to the following visitation schedule:
 - a. Visitation with the minor child, Little Boy Bloo, on the second and fourth weekends of every month, beginning Friday, July 23, 2004, from 6:00 p.m. on Friday with Defendant returning said child no later than 6:00 p.m. on Sunday.
 - b. Visitation at any other time with the permission of the Petitioner.
 - c. Visitation shall occur in a location other than Petitioner's residence.
 - d. Exchange of the child for purposes of visitation shall occur at the Choctaw Police Department.
 - e. Defendant shall not consume any alcoholic beverages or illegal substances immediately prior to or during his visitation with said child.
6. Defendant shall pay child support in the amount of \$_____ per month with the first payment due and payable on or before the first day of August 1, 2004, and with all subsequent payments due and payable on or before the first day of every month thereafter.
7. Defendant shall be excluded from the marital residence located at 707 Bloo Lane, Philadelphia, Mississippi 39350, and shall not enter upon the premises for any reason whatsoever without prior Court Approval.

8. Defendant shall be permitted to return one time to the marital residence located at 707 Bloo Lane, Philadelphia, Mississippi 39350, on _____ at _____ .m., to remove his personal belongings. Defendant may also remove the following:
_____.
- Defendant shall be accompanied by a police escort at the time he returns to Petitioner's residence to remove his belongings. Thereafter, Defendant is prevented from entering onto the premises for any reason whatsoever.
9. Petitioner shall be awarded temporary use and possession of the 2002 Chevrolet Impala.
10. Defendant shall be prohibited from the transferring, encumbering, or otherwise disposing of property mutually owned or leased by the parties, except when in the ordinary course of business.
11. Pursuant to CTC 3-10-8, it shall be illegal for Defendant to possess a firearm while subject to this Order Granting Protection from Domestic Abuse.
12. This Order shall remain in full force and effect until July 26, 2005.
13. Should Defendant violate the provisions set out in this Order, he may be arrested and incarcerated for not more than six months and fined not more than \$500.00, or both, as pursuant to C.T.C. 3-10-3, C.T.C. 3-10-6, C.T.C. 23-1-10 and C.T.C. 23-1-13.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the Order Granting Protection from Domestic Abuse entered this day is to be served as notice upon Harold Comby, Acting Director of Choctaw Police Department, in the Pearl River Community, Choctaw Indian Reservation, Mississippi 39350, so that said Police Department may act as according to law in

enforcing said Order. This Order shall remain in full force and effect until July 26, 2005, as pursuant to C.T.C. 23-1-8(2).
